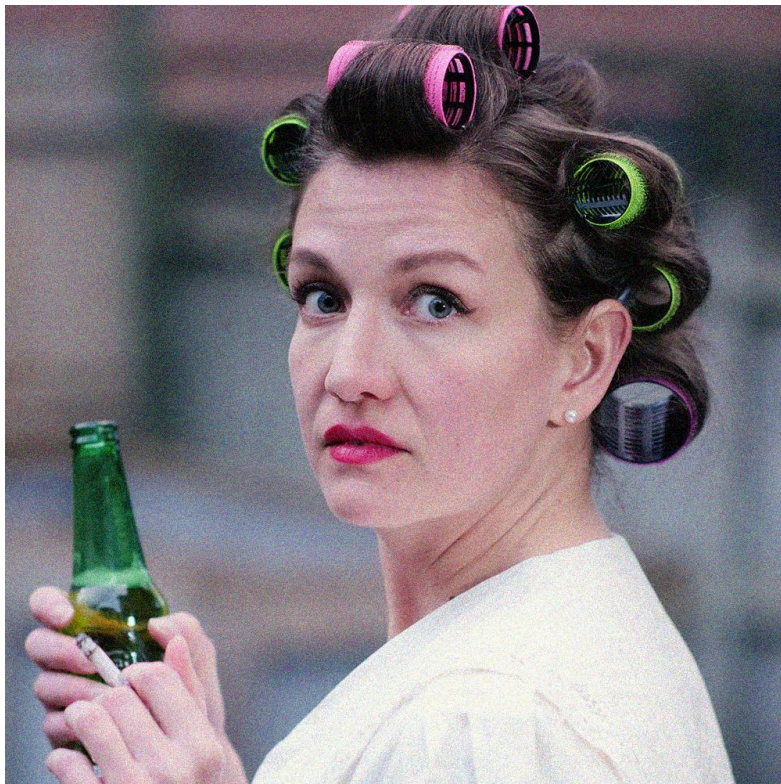

BLAIR MACMILLAN plays the role of MAE.

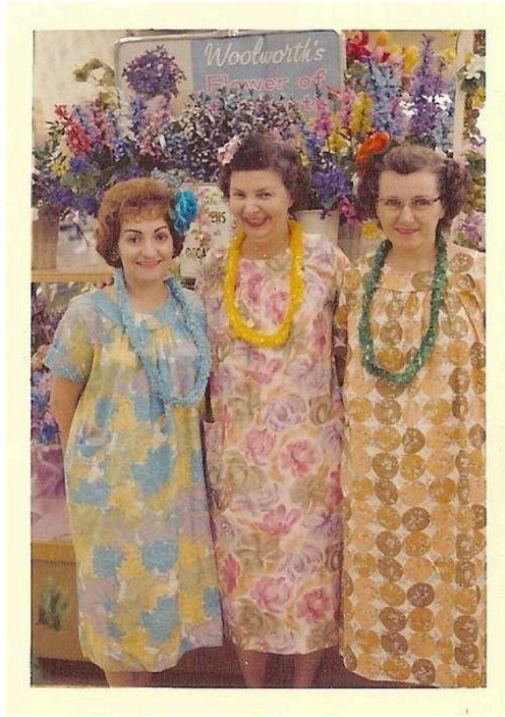
Set
