This critically-acclaimed work also enjoyed seasons at the 2016 Adelaide Fringe, the 2017 Castlemaine State Festival and the 2017 Queensland Poetry Festival. Other recent appearances include the 2016 Melbourne Emerging Writer's Festival, Melbourne Theatre Company's 2015 Neon Season, the 2014 Sydney Writers' Festival and the 2014 Indianapolis Fringe.
