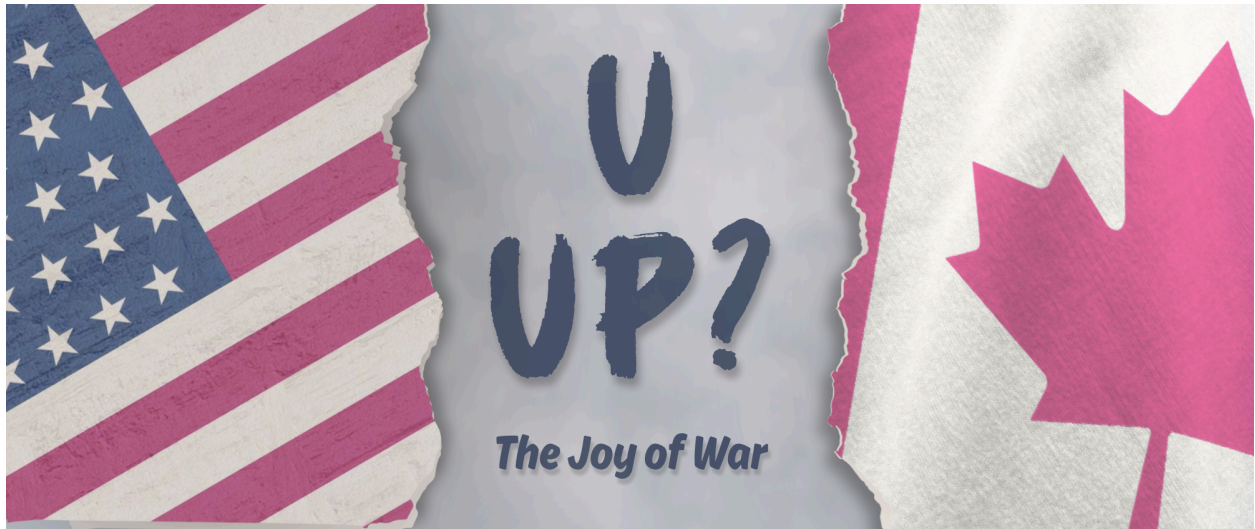

Having enemies can be fun! When four border patrol officers discover a forbidden love, they get caught in an escalating international incident that spirals belligerently out of control. Set along the world's longest undefended border, U UP? is a surreal comedy that explores national identity, authority, and long-distance relationships.
