Lise Meitner is chiefly famous for NOT getting the Nobel Prize.

"When she is perhaps best remembered for thirty years of scientific achievement, as a pioneering woman, and for the walk in the show." The finger of blame is usually pointed at the man who did get a Nobel for fission: her good friend and mentor Hahn.

Jem points that blame firmly at Swedish Physicist and Nobel Prize Winning bureaucrat Manne Siegbahn, and the dismal politics of Swedish science. He points a different finger at Hahn: for her premature disappearance from science.
