Kimia Kalantari plays the role of Myhra (based on Maria Vasilevna Voynitskaya & Marina Timofeevna). A family friend, spending the summer at the cottage.



Dale Rideout plays the role of Eli (based on Ilya Ilych Telegin). A high school friend of Xander and Mikhail, living in town.



Jaiden French plays the role of Yasmine (based on Yefim). The cousin of Xander and Sophie.
