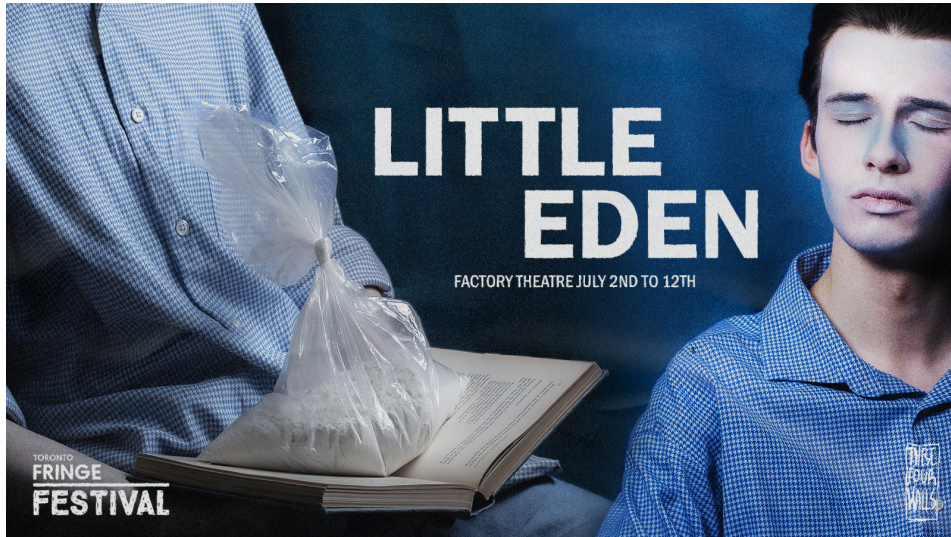


What happens when you die?

Premiering at **Factory Theatre** from **July 2nd to 12th** as a part of Toronto's Fringe Festival



*When you lose everything you know, it feels like the walls keep getting closer and closer. If the line between reality and nightmares gets blurred, **how can you continue to dream?***

Gabriel wakes up in the middle of the night, trapped in the house of his deceased grandfather. Stumbling through a series of waking nightmares, he picks away at the walls of his psyche in search of a sense of authenticity. A startlingly hopeful exploration of loss and grief, *Little Eden* is a journey through the mind of a man **defined by his past and threatened by his future.**

Little Eden explores the quiet hums of the subconscious mind in the light of adversity. Developed throughout a year of notating **dreams, rooted in dark satire and the self-reflection of one's own flaws**, the world of Gabriel has come to life in a way that's bleakly nightmarish and exceptionally real. The religious connotation of *Little Eden* is no coincidence. Gabriel, like many of us, is trying desperately to find his place in the physical and spiritual order of the world. **Can the "truth" exist** in a world of contradiction? If countless voices are yelling at you to "pick a side", how do you decide who's right and who's wrong? *Little Eden* is a play about making the most of a world that constantly seems to be set up against you. From a **unique and youthfully queer**, cross-Canadian perspective, we explore how each one of us is at odds with our past, while trying to **write our own futures.**
