MoonCow Theatre Co. believes that theatre has the capacity to make the invisible visible, to helps us see, hear, and feel the discourses of the world in a very human way. Founded by director of mixed settler and Anishinaabe ancestry Katey Lois Wattam, the work that is created by MoonCow is intercultural in its nature. For the purpose of reclaiming and decolonizing bodies, minds, and spaces MoonCow's work explores how Indigeneity can be woven with the lived experiences of identities. MoonCow's work interconnects and interweaves personal narratives, fragments of memory, vivid images, and text to create a complex emotional, cultural, and political tapestries.

Katey Lois Wattam (director) is an emerging director of mixed settler and Anishinaabe ancestry based in Montreal. After completing an Honours B. A. in Drama & Theatre at McGill University, she founded MoonCow Theatre Co., which was nominated "Most Promising English Company" at the Montreal Fringe Festival for her direction of David Gow's Cherry Docs. In 2017-2018 with the support of the MAI (Montréal, arts interculturels) mentorship program, she directed Jovette Marchessault's Night Cows which debuted at the MAI in May 2018. Night Cows has since been a part of short feminist works festival Revolution They Wrote in Montreal, and will be at Toronto Fringe this summer. She is an alum of Black Theatre Workshop's 2018/2019 Artist Mentorship program with a specialization in directing and creation. Selected directing credits include: Never Swim Alone (Beige Theatre Co.), Reaching for Starlight (AD, Geordie Theatre), Clean Slate (AD, Talisman Theatre), Her Side of the Story Festival (Festival AD, Imago Theatre), Richard III (AD, Moyse Hall). Upcoming: assistant directing The Penelopiad (dir. Yvette Nolan) in August, directing Witness in Weesageechak 32 at Native Earth Performing Arts in Novemeber, and assistant directing Reasonable Doubt (dir. Yvette Nolan) in January.
