### Company Bio

She has her minors in Sociology and Political Science and has taken Film and Screenwriting courses. Hannah recently completed a production internship at Radke Film Group, gained experience as a PA, and worked as an operations coordinator for a not-for-profit media training program, POV 3rd Street.

Bronwyn Fischer co-wrote *Sidney Needs a Kidney* and is also assistant directing the show. Bronwyn graduated from the University of Toronto with high honours in 2017, with a major in Religion, and minors in Creative Writing and English. Bronwyn is currently completing her Master's in Creative Writing at the University of Guelph and has also taken on roles as a Teacher's Assistant and Tutor. She has written two novels and is currently working on a third for publication.

Emma Workman co-wrote *Sidney Needs a Kidney*, is the stage manager, and is also the publicist for the show. Eric Gordon co-wrote *Sidney Needs a Kidney*, did the light, set, and prop design, and is co-producing the show. He also plays Mark in *Sidney Needs a Kidney*. Eric is an actor and farmer currently represented by Gorbett Talent. He graduated from the University of Toronto and Sheridan College's joint acting program with high honours in 2018. At school, Eric gained experience devising collectives and wrote, produced, and starred in a solo show utilizing the works of the late Gord Downie.
