Peter n' Chris (Peter Carlone and Chris Wilson) are a multiple Canadian Comedy Award winning sketch troupe from Vancouver, BC (Best Sketch Troupe 2012/2013, and Best Comedic Play 2013). Over the past 8 years Peter and Chris have toured the Fringe Festival and Sketch Festival circuits, where their narrative-driven, cinematic and extremely physical style has earned them a following and rave reviews across Canada and the U.S. They have been seen on Just For Laughs, JFL42, won the Just For Laughs Best Comedy Award at the Montreal Fringe Festival 3 consecutive years, have won numerous 'audience choice' awards at the Toronto Sketch Comedy festival, and have been official selections of San Francisco Sketch Comedy Festival, Chicago Sketch Comedy Festival and Gilda's Laughfest. Together they have written 7 full-length sketch comedy reviews that have individually toured all across North America. With a focus on physical comedy and narrative, Peter n' Chris have pushed the envelope on what sketch and theatrical comedy can be. There comedy has landed them jobs writing for CBC Radio's The Irrelevant Show, contributing videos to CollegeHumor, writing for White Ninja (the first webcomic created specially for Vine, starring Paul Scheer). When they aren't touring Chris Wilson lives in Toronto where he writes and acts in television's, most notably as a cast member of the second season of City TV's prank television show Meet the Family, The Beaverton and upcoming HBO ianada show What Would Sal Do? And improv with Bad Dog Repertory Players. Peter Carlone works regularly in Vancouver as a film editor, writer of children's shows for Telus World of Science and is an actor and improvisor in the city.
