

## **Company Biography**

Founded in late 2016 by <u>Tavia Christina</u> and Rachel Facchini, NFP's initial goal was to create a platform for emerging dance/movement artists to create and perform, as the company found a lack of opportunities for emerging artists within the Toronto dance community and created the company with the goal to push emerging art forward. Within the last six years, the company's ambitious goals of fostering a hub of an emerging community have been on track. NFP has hosted several events that bring together various emerging artists such as: performing at events like "New Blue Dance Festival", "Long Winter Toronto". Creating "In A Loop" an art party held in the Distillery District, that is geared towards showcasing multidisciplinary emerging artists in a playful environment allowing artists to network, interact and creating an annual online "Web Series" where emerging artists across the globe are able to premiere contemporary digital movement-based work on our platforms. As well as premiering a debut show entitled "Deimos x Phobos" (featuring company artist <u>Bri Clarke</u>), the team was comprised of emerging artists including the artistic and production team. Currently, NFP's community goals are to continue to create opportunities for emerging artists to perform and collaborate.
