From the Dora Nominated team behind “Iris (says goodbye)” and “Killing Time: A Game Show Musical”

Nova and August have been best friends since their first summer at Camp Clover, but something has snapped within their friendship between the end of camp last year and the beginning of camp this year. Now, as seventeen year olds, they are not speaking and worse, they seem to have it out for each other. Through games of capture the flag, bonfires and the end of summer dance, we learn about how friendships come to be and what happens when they grow apart.

Cast and Characters



Kayla Morgan plays the role of Nova. Nova wears an orange top with a knitted yellow vest, a crocheted bandana and a chunky necklace. She is organized and ambitious.



Jordan Gurbin plays the role of August. He wears a green check top, a red bandana and has a film camera strapped across his body. He is enthusiastic, if a little lost as to what comes next after high school.



Fern Wallenberg plays the role of Clara. She wears a yellow top with a patchwork sweater which features graphics of horses. Her hair is tucked back with a hairband. She is a leader and loves taking charge.



Elliot Metcalf plays the role of Max. Max wears a yellow, orange and green knit top with a small Camp Clover pin on the collar. He loves being crafty and is really good at getting the whole room's attention.



Arabella Ho plays the role of Moira. Moira wears a burgundy sports jersey with a chunky silver flower pendant tied around her neck. Her hair is pinned back with red star clips. She is about as competitive as it gets.



John Beer Principe plays the role of Vinny. He wears a brown sweater with a beige and orange stripe across the chest and a yellow baseball cap. He dominates at charades and capture the flag.



Alicia Goncalvez plays the role Frances. She wears burgundy overalls and a baby blue crochet hat. She is Nova's younger sister and loves to read adventure books.



Cameron Kuwayti plays the role of Leo. He wears a green striped t-shirt with a brown knit vest and a Camp Clover pin. He is August's younger brother and knows all North American bird calls.

Set

The set features a series of wooden stumps which are moved to various locations onstage throughout the show. There are bandana bunting banners and both the left and right side of the stage. A tall wooden sign gives directions to various locations around the camp, such as cabins, canoes, the mess hall, etc. Later in the show an interpretive canoe is displayed centre stage. This canoe is approximately the same size as a regular canoe but is just the frame of the shape.



Costumes

The costumes are an eclectic mix of colours and styles (the performers are wearing their costumes in the above headshots). The featured colours are mustard yellow, forest green, burnt orange, maroon and a teal blue. Each costume is reflective of the character's personality, for example, Moira is sporty and a tomboy. She wears a sports jersey and sneakers. Leo is easily influenced by the older boys at camp, so he borrows bits and pieces from everyone's style (a carabiner from Vinny, khaki shorts from August, charms on his shoes like Max, etc).
