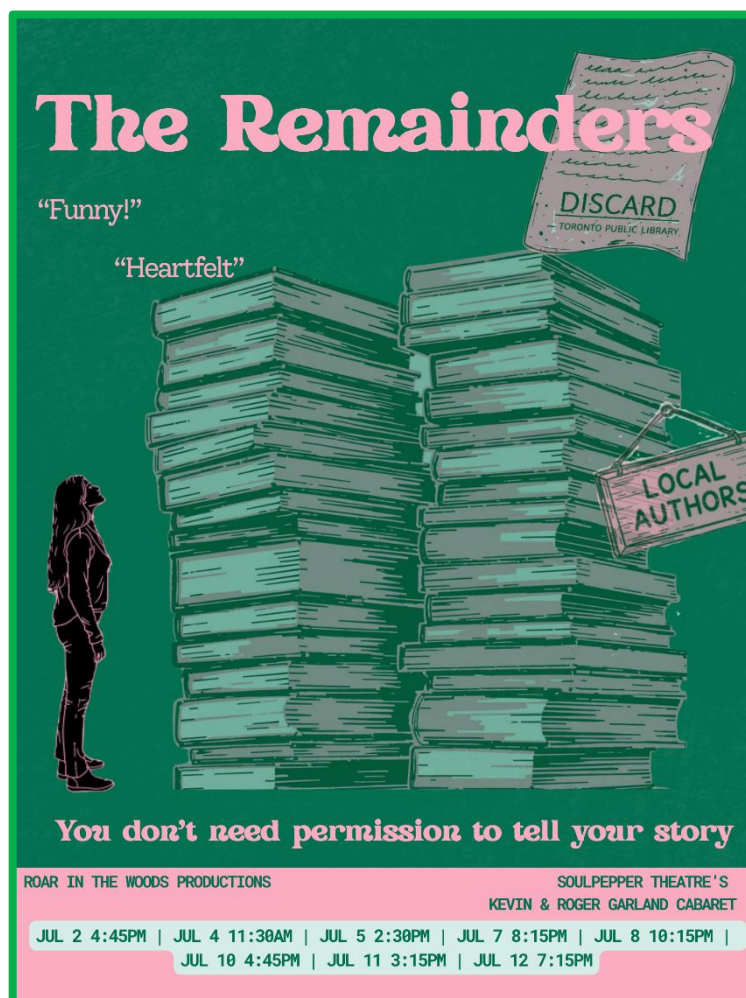

About The Reminders

In a Toronto Library branch, a determined woman fights to keep her self-published life story on the shelves — whether it belongs there or not. As staff and patrons are drawn into the conflict, an unhoused youth, a newcomer, and other library regulars begin to question whose stories are valued—and who gets left behind.

Set in one of the city’s last truly free public spaces, *The Reminders* is a sharp, funny, and heartfelt exploration of belonging, identity, and the power of being seen. As tensions rise, unexpected connections form, revealing the quiet impact of sharing—and witnessing—our stories.

Please be advised:

The Reminders is set in a realistic Toronto Public Library environment, with consistent, even lighting that reflects typical indoor library conditions (no sudden blackouts or strobe effects). Costumes are contemporary, everyday clothing that represents a range of ages and backgrounds.

The show is primarily dialogue-driven, with minimal choreography or stylized movement, making it accessible for audiences who are blind or have low

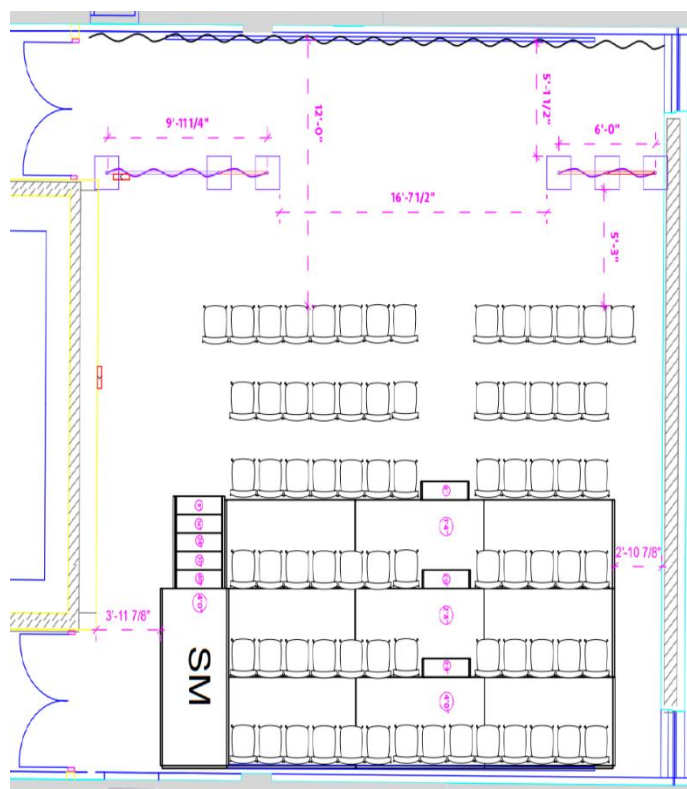
vision. Sound design is subtle, with no loud or abrupt effects; occasional voiceover or overlapping dialogue may reflect the atmosphere of a shared public space.

The production can be enjoyed by Deaf and hard-of-hearing audiences, though it is not a silent or movement-based piece.

Set:

Set is a library setting – 4 chairs, two benches, 1 small table, and two bookcases (with some books). There is also a library cart.

Wheelchair accessible and air-conditioned.
