## About Fray

"Fray" is a dark comedy about family and the urge to escape it. Not an easy thing to do when the actors are tied to each other, the set, and the props with yards and yards of stretchy string!

The choreography is inspired by physical theatre and contemporary dance, and is kinetic, visually striking, and rich in metaphor. The choreography, coupled with sharp dialogue and spot-on character work by the actors, creates a show that will have the audience laughing as well as wincing at how much the Mitchells remind them of their own families!

There is no audience interaction, and the cast never comes into the audience.

# Run Time

50 minutes with no intermission

## Content Warnings and Advisories

- “Fray” contains dance and physical theatre.
- The characters are tied together with stretchy string and get tangled up.
- There are family arguments, and several times the characters shout.
- A book is thrown, and a glass gets broken.
- There are 2 swear-words.
- Midway through, there is a dance number with the showtune “I’ll Build a Stairway to Paradise” by Gershwin played at fairly high volume with a record scratch.
- Near the end of the play there is a reference to suicide.
- The lighting is mostly a general wash and a spotlight that is used 4 times.
- There are 2 instances where the characters are back-lit

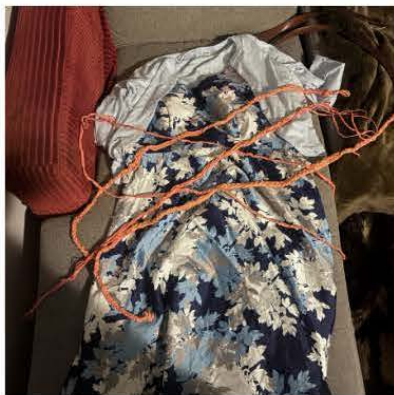
