Neuro-DIVE! at the Toronto Fringe Kids Fest

From the creator of *The ADHD Project* comes a new fantastical adventure inside a neurodiverse brain! An interactive performance for children and families, **Neuro-DIVE!** blends clown, storytelling and shadow puppetry to explore the inner workings of a brain that doesn't quite follow the "rule book". "Growing up with ADHD and a learning disability, I always imagined a mini person living in my brain, running around trying to keep everything on track." Says Rhamey. "It was a way for me to understand how my brain was different, how it sometimes had to work harder, before people spoke more openly about neurodiversity." Enter "Dina the Dopamine Receptor" as our charmingly chaotic tour guide through the brain. As Dina navigates through a typical day in the Frontal Lobe, we see her struggle with an overflowing mailroom, buzzing skeleton control panel and out of control "feelies". When Dina unknowingly sets off a mysterious alarm, she and the audience need to work together as they set off in a quest to find the elusive Reset Button. "I think a lot of people, at some point, have wished they could just press a button and be "normal". Growing up I definitely did. It took a while to understand my brain, and how to work with it, rather than against it."

Neuro-DIVE! was created in a Relaxed Performance format to be enjoyed by all kinds of minds. "I wanted to create a sort of Magic School Bus experience, where we explore the neuroscience of the brain in a re-imagined way. For younger audiences, this may be their first time learning about neurodiversity, for others it's a mirror to their own experience. Either way, I hope they leave with love and pride for their own unique brain!" **Neuro-DIVE!** opens at the Toronto Fringe on July 2nd, 2026.
