Who do you dance for?

It's 7pm in downtown Toronto where a run-down strip club gets ready to open for a usual night. As the hours go on, the workers regular schedule becomes interrupted as an old dancer comes back to visit, a lingering customer stays around, a love obsession distracts the room, and more. By the time we reach the closing hour of 4am, the dancers discover themes of identity, sex, religion, sexuality, desire, fetishization, girlhood, what femininity means as a woman of colour, and much more as a collection of poems, monologues and stories are shared throughout the night.

The Unhushed Theatre Collective was founded from past members of York University's V-day Club, where it was decided for the first time the club would not do "The Vagina Monologues" but rather create a brand-new show focused on exploring the intersectionalities missing from Eve Enseler's aforementioned play. This action was spearheaded by Megan Legesse, the creator and director of Swallow This Skin. The team of artists met every week for a period of 8 months to write poems, stories, monologues, and scenes where they were encouraged to explore their identities. Megan specifically wanted the IBPOC artists to write as full and vulnerable as possible. To enjoy writing the stories she wished she heard in "The Vagina Monologues." After a few drafts of the show, the collage of all these stories in Swallow This Skin is now ready to be heard!

Swallow This Skin was originally created to be a staged play with movement/dance being incorporated throughout the show. However, with having to adapt to a digital format. STS became an audio play. With this show being a collage of stories, the audio format surprised us with how much more vulnerable the text has become, and how the show can continue to shine in this unexpected format.
