Since Frog in Hand's first professional performance in 2012, they have produced 45+ original creations and 3 festivals sharing stories with audiences in parks, schools, gazebos, staircases, fountains, abandoned factories, elevators, galleries, street corners and theatres - continually committed to listening for stories and working in community context.

Frog in Hand is the recipient of two MARTY Awards (2017, Dance Established & 2014, Creative Community) and was nominated by My Entertainment World for Outstanding Dance Performance with their 2018 Toronto Fringe show, The Fall. For the past ten years, Frog in Hand has received funding from multiple bodies such as, Canada Council of the Arts, Ontario Arts Council, City of Mississauga, Government of Canada, various foundations for Frog in Hand and on behalf of other arts organizations.
